



## Champs Fleurs residents benefit from RBC's Blue Water Project

**Port-of-Spain, Trinidad, June 7, 2016:** Residents of Champs Fleurs in north Trinidad have openly welcomed an initiative by RBC Royal Bank to beautify and uplift the David Nakhid Recreation Ground with the planting of a variety of trees on the perimeter of the field.

Driven by parent company Royal Bank of Canada's Blue Water Day global outreach programme, more than 80 employees of RBC Royal Bank put on gloves and worked forks, hoes and shovels as they joined hands with residents of the Mt. D'Or community to plant some 200 trees on Saturday, June 4.

The RBC Blue Water Project is an historic, wide-ranging, 10-year global commitment to help protect the world's most precious natural resource: fresh water. Blue Water Day was celebrated on Thursday, June 2.

"We are delighted that RBC has come to the aid of our community. It is costly to maintain, and far more to beautify, a park like this. The trees we are planting here today will not only beautify the ground, they will also serve a more important lesson, especially for the youth of this community. They will learn how to protect and preserve the environment.

"When the trees mature, they will serve as shade for recreational and social activities. The young people will be able to play their sports and games in an enhanced setting and the community can use the park for a range of activities," said Fitzroy Browne, President of the Champs Fleurs West Community Group, which is in charge of looking after the ground.

Sharon Holder, who joined her husband, Franklyn and other residents, in the RBC Blue Water Project, expressed the hope that the initiative "would plant seeds that would help to motivate the youths of the community toward a positive lifestyle".

Located in Mt. D'Or, Champs Fleurs, the park is named after former national football captain, David Nakhid. From as early as 7 am, members of Team RBC converged at the ground and joined forces with the Champs Fleurs residents in planting a variety of trees, including oleanders, ginger lilies and durantas.

Among them was RBC Royal Bank Regional Operating Officer, Joann Gomes, who captured the true spirit of volunteerism as she marshalled the RBC forces. "Water is one of the world's most precious natural resources, fundamental to life on our planet. Now, more than ever, protecting such a vital part of our existence is a responsibility that we owe not only to ourselves, but to generations to come. Trees are very essential for protecting our fresh water resources. The trees we are putting down here today will help to protect the watershed in this community. And we share the view of the residents that this Blue Water Project would jumpstart many positive activities for the community," Gomes said.

In the sister isle, 25 RBC employee volunteers planted a kitchen garden and created a decorative garden at the entrance of the St. Nicholas Primary School. Students and their parents gave a helping hand and a donation was presented to the school.
