

Cheque fraud hits businesses hard

When your business relies on issuing a high volume of cheques to your suppliers daily, it's important to protect yourself from cheque fraud.

The last thing you want is for a supplier to not get paid or for you to be out large sums of cash. How often does it happen?



3 common types

Counterfeit cheques Printed on non-bank paper to look genuine

Sophisticated counterfeit cheques Uses an issuer's or a legitimate cheque's serial number sequence

Altered cheques

A legitimate cheque stolen and altered with a fake payee name and address.

STEP 1

At the end of each day, transmit a file to us that contains the details of every cheque issued. RBC Payee Match will then compare each cheque presented for payment with your details and detect any discrepancies.



STEP 2

Each morning, you'll receive a courtesy email indicating any cheque details that do not match the information you sent us, such as serial numbers, payee names, addresses or amounts that may have been altered. You will need to log into the service and review each unmatched cheque.



STEP 3

You can then request the unmatched cheques to be returned, and reissue new cheques with the correct information, so your suppliers can be paid on time.
