

Client Guide: Receiving Money from Local Banks via BiMPay

What you'll share with your sender

To receive a BiMPay payment from another local bank, you'll give the sender two pieces of information about your RBC account:

Branch Transit Number — a 5-digit number that identifies the RBC branch where your account is held (*e.g., St. Lawrence branch: 05605*)

Account Number — a 7-digit number unique to your account (*e.g., 1234567*)

How to share it — it depends on the sender's bank

Different banks ask for this information in different ways. Here's how to handle each situation:

The sender's bank asks for...	What to do
Branch Transit and Account Number as separate fields	Provide each value on its own. (<i>e.g., Transit: 05605 / Account: 1234567</i>)
A combined Branch Transit and Account Number	Combine them into one string, transit first. (<i>e.g., 056051234567</i>)
No specific instructions	

The sender's bank asks for...	What to do
	Share the values separately, and ask the sender to confirm with their bank how payments should be entered on their platform.


Good to know: Getting this right upfront means your money arrives quickly — no delays, no follow-up.
