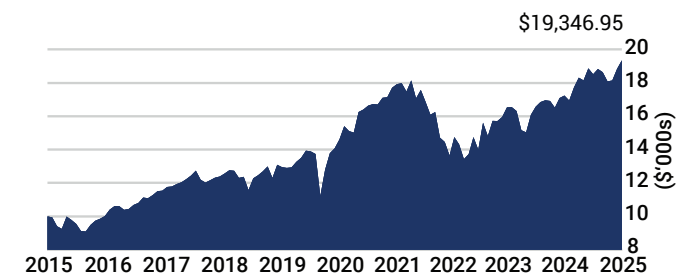

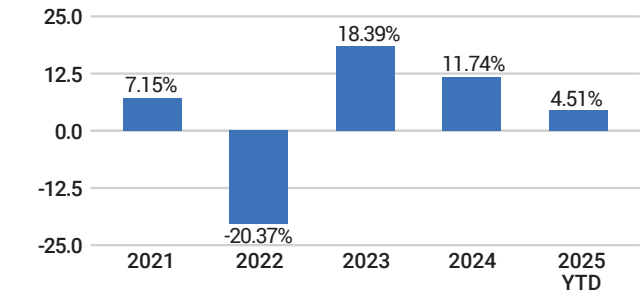

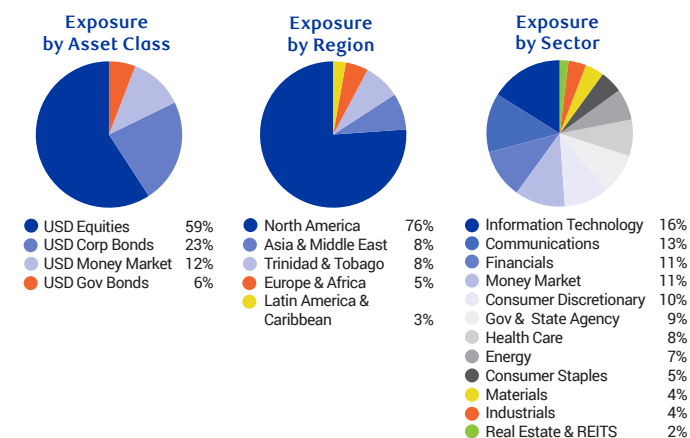
Calendar Returns (%)

Market Update

Bureau of Labor Statistics data showed that the US economy added 147,000 jobs in June 2025. Combined with April's 158,000 jobs and May's 144,000 jobs, this brought the three-month average payroll growth to around 150,000. Inflation data showed that the Personal Consumption Expenditure (PCE) Price Index increased 0.3% month-over-month in June 2025. The index for shelter rose 0.2% in June and was the primary factor in the all-items monthly increase. The much-preferred core PCE index (which excludes food and energy), rose 0.2% in June. Food prices increased 0.3% and energy prices rose 0.9%. Annually, PCE inflation rose to 2.7%, in line with forecasts. The core rate came in at 2.9%, still far above the Fed's target of 2%. Central bankers, led by Chair Jerome Powell, have stated that they will not lower rates yet. They assert that the U.S. economy is in a strong enough position now that the Fed can afford to wait to see the impact tariffs will have on inflation.

The second quarter of 2025 saw the S&P 500 gain 10.57%. The quarter began with President Donald Trump announcing a surprisingly aggressive tariff plan on April 2. Between April 2 and April 8, the S&P 500 dropped over 12%. That was the worst four trading-day drop since March 2020. Then, on April 9, Trump announced a "pause" on the most severe of the tariffs, touching off a 9% rally in a single day. That was the largest one-day gain for the S&P 500 since October 2008 and the 8th largest percentage gain ever. The rally continued in May and June and, by the end of the quarter, global stocks were hitting new all-time highs. Part of the continued rally came from strong earnings. During the quarter, 78% of S&P 500 companies reported earnings that were above Wall Street forecasts. Information Technology, Communications and Industrials were the best performing sectors with returns of 23.50%, 18.20% and 12.56% respectively. Both Information Technology and Communications house the 'Magnificent Seven', which fuelled the stock market's recovery this quarter. The outsized gains came despite lingering concerns over slowing economic growth, potentially sticky inflation and rising valuations. The Industrials sector performance was led by Aerospace and Defence. The market has become more optimistic that Trump administration policies could revitalize the US manufacturing base, which would be a favourable development for industrials. Furthermore, the US economy remains resilient, industrial production has been steady, and new orders for durable goods have trended higher, with May new orders up nearly 20% year over year, aided by a surge in commercial aircraft orders. Amidst prevailing macroeconomic headwinds, we are maintaining a disciplined investment approach, which allows us to capitalise on new areas of strength and long-term secular growth opportunities.
